The Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee of the City of Fernandina Beach Florida, met on Tuesday, January 14, 2020 at 5:00 pm in the City Hall Chambers. Present were: Member Ross, Member Bartelt, Member Pugh, Chair Duncan, Member Kegler, Vice-Chair Behan, Commissioner Chapman

1. Call to Order: Chair Duncan called the meeting to order at 5:03pm.
2. Roll Call
3. Approval minutes.
Member Ross made a motioned to approve the minutes, with no changes. Member Kegler seconded the motion. Motion passed being all ayes.
4. Presentation
 - 4.1 Lorelei Jacobs, Grants Administrator for the City of Fernandina Beach.
Lorelei stated that there will be a public workshop on Thursday January 23 at the Peck Center at 6:00p to discuss a school to downtown trail.
Mike Spino, with Friends of Amelia Island Trails, presented a Powerpoint presentation about the current trails on Amelia Island. Mike stated that they are in the pre-planning stage for a trail connecting Fernandina Beach schools to downtown Fernandina Beach. The proposed trail will include Hickory St., S. 11th St., Gum St., S. 3rd St., Beech St., S. 2nd St. and Ash St. Mike Spino and Mike Pikula have participated in a community outreach campaign by knocking on doors and handed out flyers to roughly 49 affected homes. Rex Lester and the Streets Department will install signage to indicate where the trail will be located prior to the January 23rd meeting.
Member Pugh asked when the grant application would be submitted. Lorelei stated that the plan is to ask for community input prior to applying for the grant. After public input, she plans on applying for a grant in late summer.
Member Kegler expressed a concern about lighting on the current trails. He requested that lighting be included in the planning of the proposed trail.
Chair Duncan commented that she appreciates the transparency as it relates to applying for the grant.
Vice-Chair Behan questioned the Will Hardee/Citrona Dr. intersection plan. Mike Spino stated there is no plan for that location at this time. Vice-Chair Behan appreciates the work that has been done thus far on this project. She requested that in the planning to incorporate dog bags and trash receptacles along the trail.

Not available at this time.
 - 4.3 Philip Chapman, 2120 Florida Avenue
Addressed concerns about his responsibilities as liaison.
Chair Duncan requested that the Commissioner please respond at meetings and respond to emails.
Member Pugh agreed with his frustration stating that there is no policy or direction or guidelines for any of the City advisory boards or their liaisons.

Commissioner Chapman asked if any of the committee members had prepared and submitted a design for Simmons Park. The response from Pugh and Duncan was no. That is not within the committee's purview.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

6. DISCUSSION

6.1 Bylaws: there was a review of the bylaws that were prepared by the subcommittee. Member Pugh suggested that the committee review the four sample by-laws. Alisha will send out tomorrow.

6.2 Work plan: Member Pugh stated that the last work plan that was submitted was done July 2018. Nan will provide the work plan template. Member Ross suggested that they create a subcommittee to work on the work plan presentation for the City Commission. Member Pugh reported that she researched and discovered a report about advisory boards. Member Pugh will send this report to Nan to distribute to the board. Commissioner Ross requested that Member Pugh also send the document/report to the City Manager and request that he can distribute the report to the Commission for review. Member Ross suggested that the P&R Director provide a document monthly about what the P&R department is doing.

6.3 Master Plan: There was a discussion about voting on the proposed changes to the Master Plan. Member Ross moved that the Parks and Recreation Master Plan Amendments 2019 be accepted. Motion was seconded by Member Bartelt. Motion passed being all ayes.

7. OTHER BUSINESS

Member Ross went to a wheelchair activity with Commissioner Ross. Member Ross presented a written document about the experience. Member Ross suggested reviewing the 8 Flags design for Simmons Road Park when it is presented. Member Ross also suggested including one piece of inclusive equipment in each park. The Board requested that Nan bring the Central Park playground plans to the next meeting to update the Committee.

Member Ross presented a handout with updates about the air quality testing.

8. ADJOURNMENT

Member Ross made a motion to adjourn, Member Pugh seconded, Meeting adjourned at 6:29p by Chair Duncan.

FERNANDINA BEACH DOG PARK

FACT SHEET

PURPOSE – The purpose is to provide a controlled, off-leash, dog park for area residents. The park would be part of the Recreation and Parks program for the City of Fernandina Beach. Currently, there are no free off-leash areas for dogs.

GOAL - To establish a fenced-in, off-leash dog park where well-behaved canine citizens can exercise in a clean, safe environment without endangering or annoying people, property or wildlife. The intention is to develop a beautiful, well-maintained space open to all dog lovers and friends who are willing to uphold the park's rules.

SITE – A tentative site has been identified by the City that is properly zoned and available for this park. The site is approximately 42,000 square feet in size and adjacent to North 11th Street. The property is within walking distance to Central Park. The site has mature hardwood trees and is well grassed.

CONSERVATION – The proposed layout of the park elements will not impact or alter the tree layout. There is no underbrush or other fauna that would be affected.

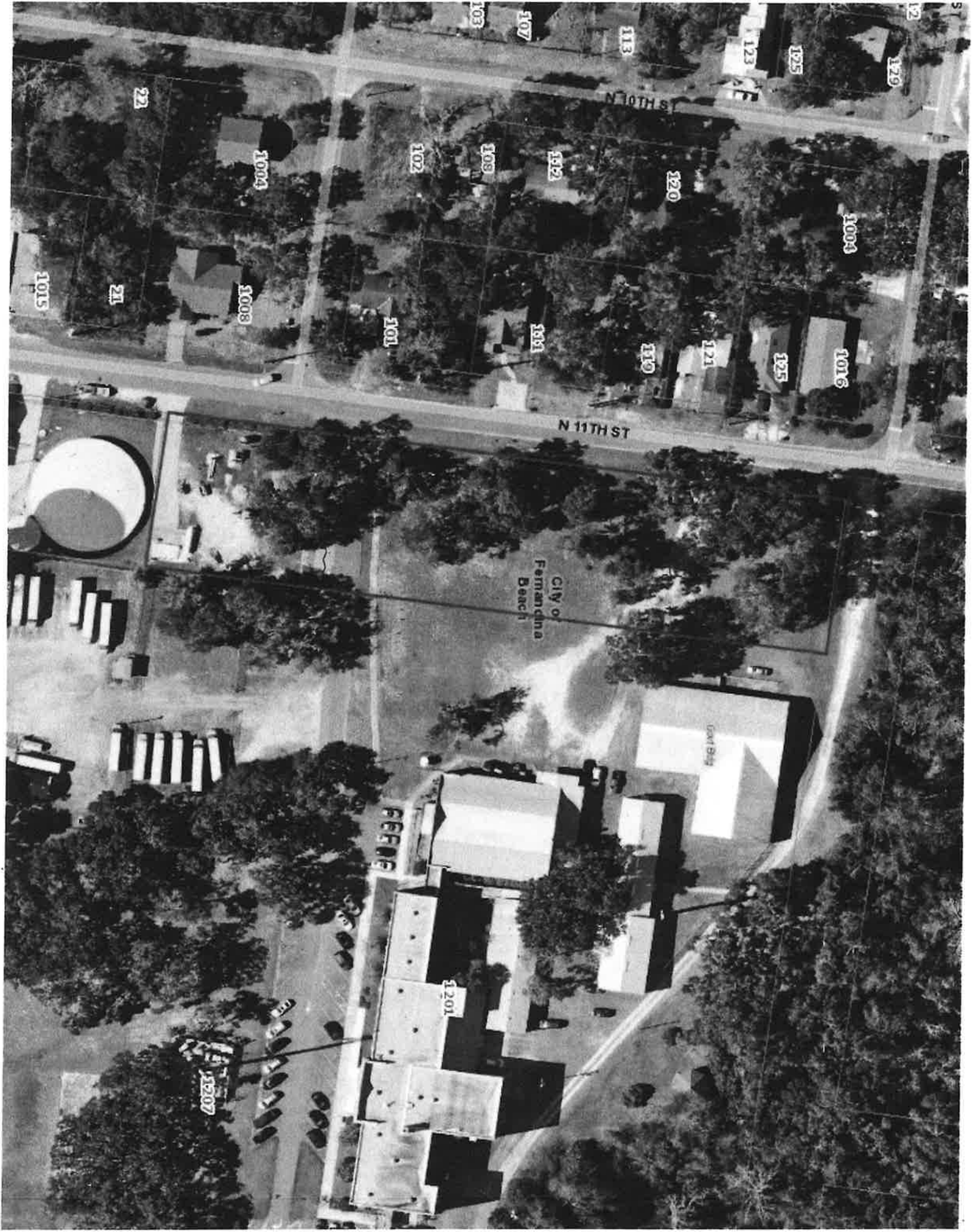
DESIGN – The dog park is being designed in general conformance to accepted standards being used in the better dog parks across the country. The park will be built in general accordance with American Kennel Club and similar organization recommendations. Environmental considerations, such as using bio-degradable dog waste bags will be a feature of this park. There will be handicapped accessible parking and a viewing area

FUNDING – Initially, donations of time, materials and labor will be furnished by the community under the umbrella of the starting group of volunteers. Sponsors will be needed. A budget is being prepared for presentation to the City for further capital funding. It is anticipated that volunteers will help govern and maintain the park.

PROCESS – The design and layout of the dog park needs to be approved by the City. Any support during this process is helpful and would be appreciated.

Citizen involvement and support needs to occur for this park to become a reality.

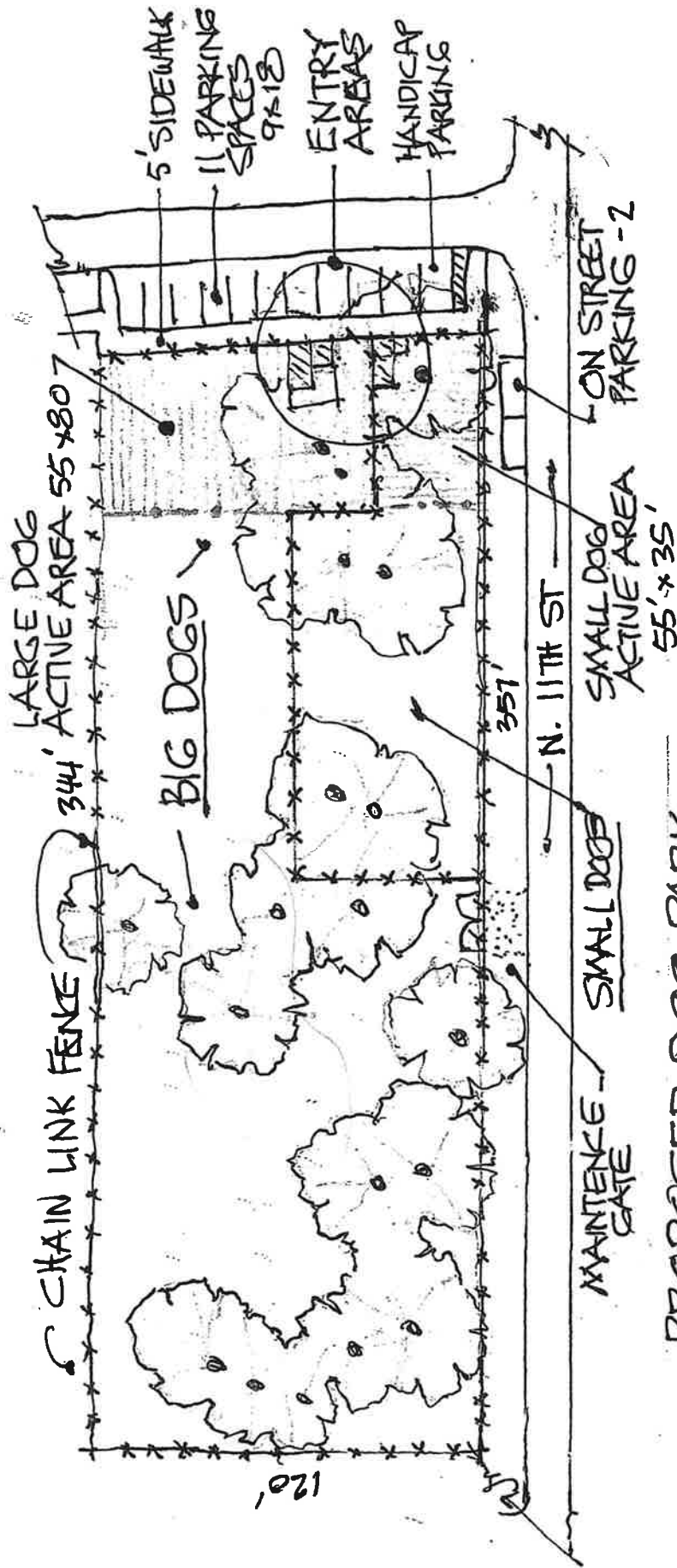

PROPOSED DOG PARK

OFFICIAL RULES OF THE FERNANDINA BEACH DOG PARK

- This park is for the use of residents and their pets only
- Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by them. Dogs should be under control at all times.
- Dogs must be properly licensed, inoculated and healthy to use the park.
- Animals must wear a collar and ID tags at all times.
- Dogs showing aggression or excessive barking must be removed from the park.
- Animals exhibiting a history of aggressive behavior will be banned.
- Owners must not leave their dogs' unattended, and must clean up after their dogs.
- Children under the age of 16 are not permitted in the park unless supervised by an adult.
- Dogs in heat or with parasites or disease are not allowed inside the park.
- No food, beverages, glass, sharp objects or weapons are permitted inside the park.
- Dogs must be leashed before entering and prior to leaving the park. Keep entry gates closed at all times.
- **OWNERS: You are responsible for your dogs!** Failure to obey any of these rules may result in police action or expulsion from the park

INFORMATION

- Park hours are from 8:00 to Sunset. No use during darkness hours.
- This is a self-policing, volunteer assisted park.
- Everyone is responsible to control their pets
- Everyone is expected to be courteous to each other and to neighbors

(REVISED January 16, 2020)

I. Mission or Purpose:

As Set Forth by City Resolution, Resolution #2005-67, adopted April 5, 2005 created the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee “to recommend plans and programs designed to meet and satisfy the recreational needs of the community, and to make recommendations for improvements to the park system that will attain the goals and objectives set forth in the Recreation and Open Space Element of the adopted Comprehensive Plan.”

Resolution #2009-05 amended Resolution 2005-67 by adding to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee’s mission “to assist with the long-range Capital Improvement planning of the Parks and Recreation Department.”

Parks and Recreation Mission Statement or Purpose:

Therefore as stated by City Resolution, the Fernandina Beach Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee shall recommend plans and programs designed to meet and satisfy the recreational needs of the community, and to make recommendations for improvements to the park system that will attain the goals and objectives set forth in the Recreation and Open Space Element of the adopted Comprehensive Plan and assist with long-range Capital Improvement planning of the Parks and Recreation Department.

II. Membership:

- A. Members appointed to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee should fairly represent the demographic composition of the City (Resolution 2005-67)
- B. Terms shall be 2 members for 3 year terms, 2 members for 2 year terms, and 3 members for 1 year terms. (Resolution 2009-05)
- C. Members’ attendance shall meet the requirements set by the City Commission for all City committees or boards.

III. Responsibilities:

A. Ethical Responsibilities

- 1. First priority, each member shall represent and advocate for what is best for the City of Fernandina Beach as a whole, putting aside personal or special interests.
- 2. The Recreation Advisory Board is an appointed board subject to the State of Florida ethics laws, chapter 112, the Government in the Sunshine Laws, chapter 286, and the Public Records Laws, chapter 119.
- 3. Florida Statutes, Section 112.311 through 112.326 sets forth a code of ethics for public officers and employees.
- 4. Violations of ethical responsibilities may result in removal from the Advisory Committee by the City Commission.

B. Committee Responsibilities

1. Adopt bylaws and other rules of procedure to achieve its purposes and functions.
2. Advise the initiation, planning, design, and to recommend a system of parks, facilities, etc., that will accommodate the public's need for parks and recreation activities through a Parks and Recreation Master Plan.
3. Implement the goals and objectives of the most recent Fernandina Beach Comprehensive Plan, Recreation and Open Space Element of the City's Comprehensive Plan, and the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.
4. Recommend changes to the Land Development Code and Comprehensive Plan to the Planning Board to implement the goals and objectives of the Recreation and Open Space Element within the Comprehensive Plan as a whole.
5. Recommend actions which enhance the safety and security of site locations and physical facility standards.
6. Annually advise the City Commission of the Committee's Plan of Work.
7. Shall promote close cooperation between the City and all private citizens, institutions, and agencies interested in or conducting recreational activities, so that all recreational resources within the City may be coordinated to secure the greatest public welfare for the citizens of Fernandina Beach.

C. The Chairperson's Responsibilities

1. Preside at all regular and special meetings. Conduct meetings in an efficient manner, focusing on the issues relevant to the functions and mission. A short civility statement shall be read at the opening of each meeting as is necessary.
2. Regulate and facilitate discussion among board members to ensure that all viewpoints are represented. Give each member the opportunity to express ideas and/or concerns on issues that are being considered by the board or commission. The Chairperson shall give due consideration to all board members.
3. Assist in orienting new board members about the function, role and mission of the committee at noticed meetings.
4. Assist in mediating conflicts or disputes between board/commission members.
5. Represent the committee in appearing before the City Commission as designated by the Board.
6. With their consent, appoint members to serve on committees.
7. Foster compliance with the "Florida Sunshine Law."
8. Sign all appropriate documents.

D. Commissioner Liaison Responsibilities

1. Liaison to communicate all votes made by the PRAC to the City Commission in a timely manner.
2. Liaison to communicate to PRAC any upcoming agenda items that relate to PRAC's roles and duties.
3. Liaison to attend all PRAC meetings for the purpose of providing information, answering questions, and relaying information and communication between the commission and the PRAC.

IV. Rules of Committee Procedure

A. Election of Officers

1. The election of a Chairperson and Vice Chair shall be held annually at the first regular meeting in January.
2. In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall be the presiding officer of the Advisory Committee.
3. Elections may be held at any time due to officer vacancies on the Advisory Committee.

B. General Procedural Rules

1. Parliamentary procedure in Committee meetings shall be informal. However, if required to keep order, Committee meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

2. Action of the Advisory Committee shall be made by motion, nominated, and seconded. Approval of the motion shall be by majority vote of those members present. Failure to receive a majority vote shall act as a denial of the proposed motion.
3. Approved actions taken by the Advisory Committee shall be recorded in the minutes of the committee meeting.
4. The Chairperson may limit the amount of time allowed for each person wishing to make public comment at an Advisory Committee meeting.
5. Special or Subcommittee meetings may be called by the Chairperson or by any three members of the Committee.
6. General procedural rules may be suspended during special meetings or subcommittee meetings.
7. Special Committees or Subcommittees are subservient to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee and report their recommendations to the Advisory Committee for review and action. The Parks and Recreation Committee may overrule any recommendation of any subservient committee.

C. Agendas

1. Permanent agenda items for All Regular Meetings shall contain:
 - a. Approval of the Minutes
 - b. Public Comments Not on the Agenda
 - c. Facility Update Report
 - d. Committee Items Not on the Agenda
 - e. Adjournment
2. Additional Agenda Items and Due Dates
 - a. Committee members and Department members may submit additional agenda items to a designated Parks and Recreation Department representative prior to publication deadlines which are generally 7 days before the meeting.
 - b. A Parks and Recreation Department representative shall notify all Committee members of agenda deadline dates seven (7) days in advance of agenda's deadline of publication.
 - c. Committee members may submit informational items related to published agenda items 5 days prior to a published scheduled meeting.
 - d. The Chairperson shall approve items to be placed on the agenda prior to publication.
 - e. All items on the agenda for presentations must include the topic of discussion and the speaker's name. Related presentation materials and handouts shall be placed in the agenda packet.

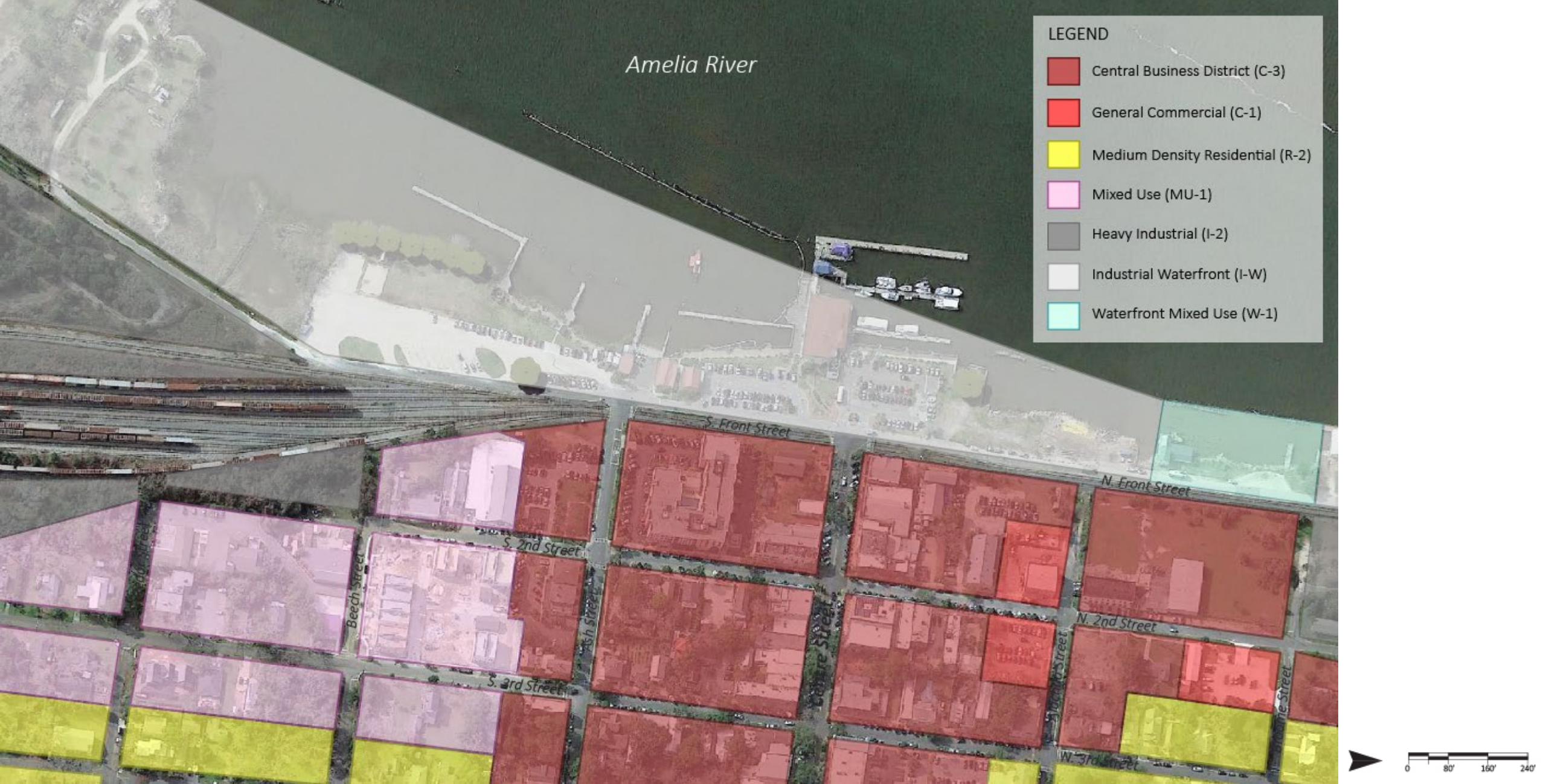

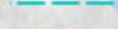

 - Local Mitigation Strategy
 - Plan for 3' sea level rise
- Focus on Ash to Alachua

- Elements for the plan
 - Support marina needs
 - **Bandstand** (NOT amphitheater)...movies in the park, “Honey Badgers” music events
 - Gazebo, potentially with overlook
 - No true “playground”, but potentially thematic play area (industrial)
 - No waterpark
 - Improved retail space around boat ramp...and keep boat ramp
 - **Sunset Plaza**

COMMISSIONER LEDNOVICH

- 3 Purposes
 1. **River** is the **attraction**
 2. **Stormwater** / flood mitigation / resiliency
 3. **Support** working **marina**
- Does *not* want development (no condos, businesses, etc.)
 - Explain impact for (1) residents, (2) visitors, (3) economic development...how it augments downtown
- Elements for the plan
 - **Green**space and shade from trees
 - Continuous river walk...potentially shift Atlantic Seafood across railroad tracks
 - Secondary restroom
 - Stormwater
 - Bandshell with event lawn
