The Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee of the City of Fernandina Beach Florida, met virtually on Tuesday, August 11, 2020 at 3:30 pm. Present was Vice Chair Behan, Member Bartelt, Member Ross, Member Pugh, Member LaJoux

1. Call to Order: Vice Chair Behan called the meeting to order at 3:33pm
2. Roll Call
3. Pledge of Allegiance
4. Minutes
Member Ross made a motion to approved with the necessary corrections to the March 10, 2020 minutes. Motion seconded by Member Bartelt. Motion to approve minutes with the necessary corrections passed with all ayes.
5. Election
Postponed until the next meeting.
6. PRESENTATION
6.1 Bosque Bello Columbarium, Sal Cumella gave a brief synopsis of the reason for the need for the columbarium. Jeremy Marquis and Fremont Latimer gave a presentation. Member Bartelt suggested a special meeting for an onsite visit prior to approving this proposal. Member Pugh and Member Ross suggested more financial information be provided prior to approving this proposal. Member Ross made a motion to table this discussion until the September meeting. Member Bartelt seconded the motion. Motion passed with all ayes.

6.2 Community Equity Project, Member Behan informed the group about the project and the objective. She will provide more information as things progress. The group is requesting support from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee.
7. DISCUSSION
7.1 Vehicular Parking in the Grass
Parks & Recreation staff gave background on the discussion item. Member Pugh suggested tabling this until the next meeting due to time restraints. Member Pugh requested additional information on the discussion item. How many events does the City host that involve vehicles parking on the City parks grassy area Alisha will provide that information.
8. OTHER BUSINESS
Member Pugh stated that the Committee had discussed having the ad hoc distinction removed from this committee's resolution. Commissioner Lednovich suggested the group vote to amend the resolution. Member Pugh made a motion to request that commission amend the resolution to remove "ad hoc". Motion seconded by Member Ross. Motion passed being all ayes.
Member Pugh stated that the agenda is not following the bylaws. The agenda layout does not match the bylaws and the agenda is not being sent to the committee a week

prior to printing agenda. Also requested that the approved bylaws be sent to the other committee members. City Staff, Nan Voit, stated agenda item request are sent out prior to a week before the meeting.

Member Pugh would like to work on a process to get City Commission request communicated to the Committee. Commissioner Lednovich explained how dog park landed on the City Commission agenda and asked for direction from the Committee. Member Ross recommended tabling this discussion.

Member Ross asked if there were any PRAC applications. Voit informed the committee that there were none at this time.

Adjournment

Member Ross made a motion to adjourn, Vice Chair Behan seconded the motion.

Environmental Heroes' Grove Fernandina Beach Central Park

Amelia Tree Conservancy proposes to donate a commemorative grove to the City of Fernandina Beach, to be located in Central Park and to be installed in December 2020. Central Park has a number of activity centers for sports, musical events, fairs, etc. However, it does not have quiet shaded groves for rest and regeneration. This grove would pay tribute to those on this island who have volunteered their time and talents to preserving and restoring the environment of the island.

Project Goal: Create a grove in Central Park that provides a therapeutic place for rest and regeneration, a tribute to those who have volunteered to maintain our environment and an inspiration to future volunteers. (Refer to the attached diagram and conceptual sketch.)

Objectives:

- Contribute to canopy restoration in Fernandina Beach by planting six native trees and eleven native shrubs to create a grove in combination with existing trees
- Create a space for rest, contemplation and regeneration within Central Park. Tennis and pickleball players and runners will have a cooler, shady place to rest. Girl Scouts will have a private place to chat. Others will find the grove a place to meditate.
- Educate the public by increasing awareness and appreciation of the Amelia Island maritime forest canopy
- Promote community engagement in the preservation of the Amelia Island environment by engaging the public in the creation of the grove space
- Honor those who have volunteered to support our environment
- Inspire new volunteers to protect our environment

Draft of text for plaque:

At the heart of the grove, surrounded by shrubs, will be a brick structure with a bronze plaque on top to clarify the purpose of the grove and major donors.

This grove is dedicated to volunteers who donated their time and skills to the environment of Amelia Island. We honor their efforts and accomplishments.

What can you contribute to preserving our environment?

Amelia Tree Conservancy expresses our appreciation to our members and other donors who made this grove possible:

This grove was designed and implemented by Arthur Herman, landscape architect and ATC Board member.

Criteria for heroes:

- Contributed substantially to maintaining or improving any aspect of our environment, including but not limited to our beach and dunes, the maritime forest and upland woodlands, other native flora, our marshes and other wetlands, our creeks, the wildlife that are permanent or temporary residents of our island, wildlife corridors, our air and water quality.
- Contributed on an individual basis or as part of a group
- Contributed as a volunteer
- No longer living

Bricks in honor of volunteers:

The bricks below the plaque will be engraved with the names of volunteers as they are approved. ATC is proposing that the initial volunteers to be honored include: Becky Jordi, Phil Scanlan, Joan Bean, Tom Raymond and MaVynnee Betsch.

Tentative process for approval of future volunteers to be honored:

The following process will need input and approval from the Director of Parks and Recreation, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, and the City Commission:

1. Information regarding this honor, the criteria and process will be made readily available to the public on the Parks & Rec web page, the city Facebook page and published in the News Leader and Observer.
2. Any resident of Amelia Island may nominate a candidate by completing a nominating form and writing a description of the contributions of the individual and submitting it to the Parks and Recreation Director.
3. Once a year, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee will consider candidates nominated by the public and vote on those who should be added to the grove.
4. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee Chair will present the recommended candidates to the City Commission for approval.
5. Parks and Recreation, in collaboration with ATC, will implement the addition. For as long as it is in operation, ATC will incur the cost of preparing the bricks for installation.

Background on Amelia Tree Conservancy:

The goal and objectives of this project reflect the mission of Amelia Tree Conservancy. Our official mission statement is as follows:

Environmental Heroes' Grove Fernandina Beach Central Park

Amelia Tree Conservancy (ATC) is a diverse coalition of Amelia Island citizens and friends dedicated to preserving our maritime forest canopy—native island trees, understory and the unique environment they create. Our mission is to:

- Preserve the maritime forest on Amelia Island, FL.
- Educate the public and increase awareness regarding the nature and composition of the Amelia Island maritime forest canopy ecosystem and its importance in creating a habitat for humans, birds, animals and plants.
- Promote community engagement in the preservation and welfare of the Amelia Island canopy.
- Contribute to the reforestation of lost canopy on Amelia Island.
- Use all earnings and property exclusively for these charitable and educational purposes.

While ATC has not done the extent of planting on the island that we would like to do, we have been involved in the following planting activities:

- ATC planted a row of seven Live Oak trees for the Boys and Girls Club (between the Club and Southside Elementary School. Elementary school students participated in the planting, and we had an associated workshop with Becky Jordi for participants in the Boys and Girls Club. January 21, 2014.
- ATC donated to landscaping around the County Library following its renovation.
- ATC donated Live Oak trees to the Egans Creek Playground and, together with 8Flags volunteers, watered the trees through their first summer. Grand opening April 27, 2017.
- ATC planted two Live Oak trees at the American Beach Community Center in celebration of American Beach Day in honor of the 85th anniversary of the founding of the community. January 25, 2020.

ATC had intended to complete a major planting around the ball fields on the south side of Hickory St. in March 2020, but this project was not proposed formally after the School Board announced their intention to sell the land for development.

ATC always ensures that the trees and shrubs we plant are of optimal quality and size for planting. We prefer to plant between the end of hurricane season and the end of March.

Arthur Herman, ATC board member, designs and manages all of our planting efforts. He is a retired professional landscape architect with forty-five years of experience at Fordham University, the New York Botanical Garden and the City of Stamford, Connecticut. Among many other achievements, Mr. Herman created the forest that is currently the campus of Fordham University, for which he was awarded the Best Urban Campus Award. Mr. Herman will ensure that the community is involved in the creation of this grove.

TECHNICAL PROPOSAL FOR ENVIRONMENTAL HEROES' GROVE

Create a grove at Central Park to honor individuals who have contributed to the preservation of our island.

Scope of work: (refer to attached diagram)

- Establish a monument to house a plaque explaining the intention of the park and listing the major donors. (possible donation)
- Create crushed stone pathways leading to the center monument
- Establish bricks which will be engraved with our heroes' names.
- Plant numerous native trees and shrubs to soften the area and promote the intending grove. (includes labor)
- Add benches (city specifications) to surrounding area
- Bronze plaque

Materials list:

- 4 - 3" Live Oaks
- 2- 12'-14' Magnolia
- 11 – assorted native shrubs (to be selected by designer)
- 3 – 4' benches (city specifications)
- 7 yards crushed gravel
- Weed control fabric
- Brick monument (as in Egan's Creek park)
- 400 square ft of brick to include heroes' names
- Steel edging 300ft.

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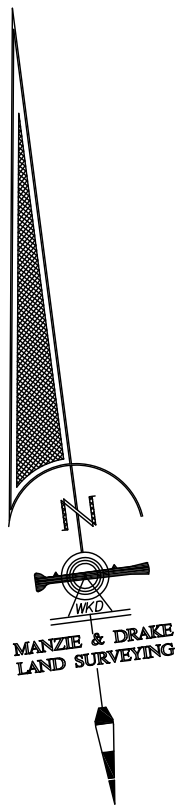
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MAP OF SPECIFIC PURPOSE SURVEY

FERNANDINA BEACH, FLORIDA

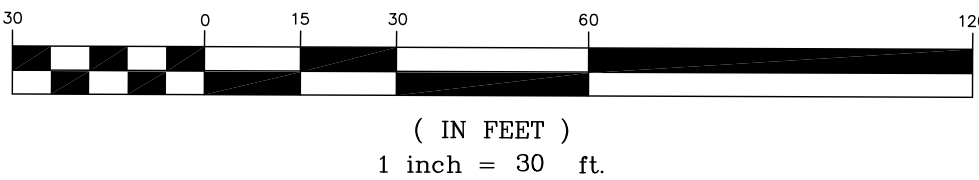

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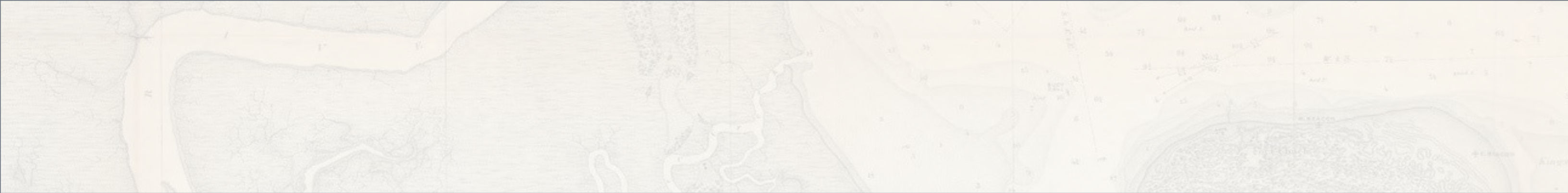

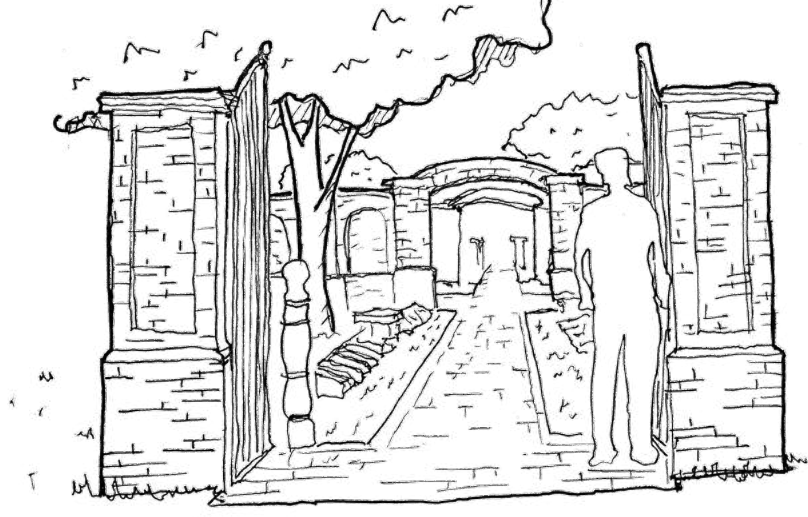

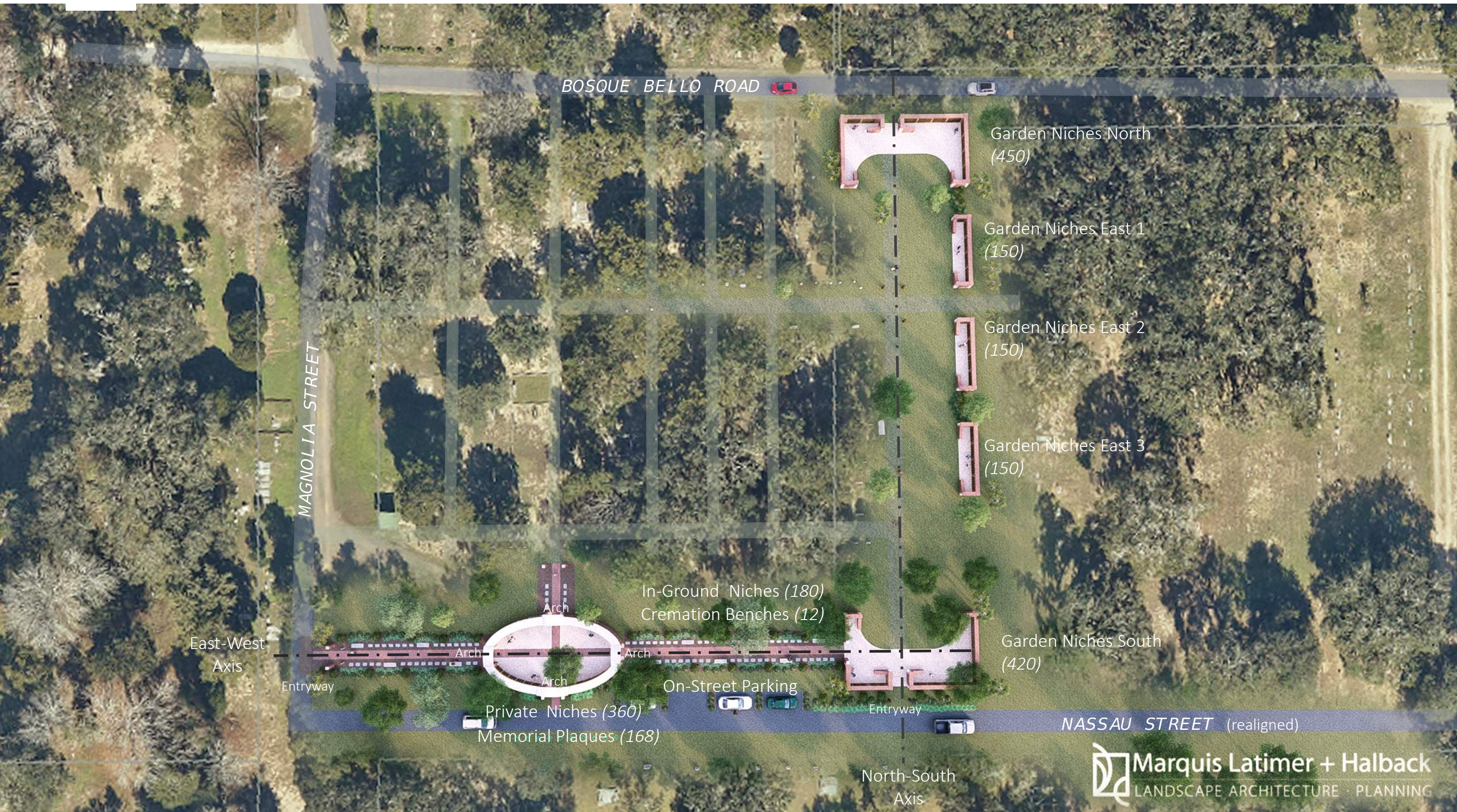

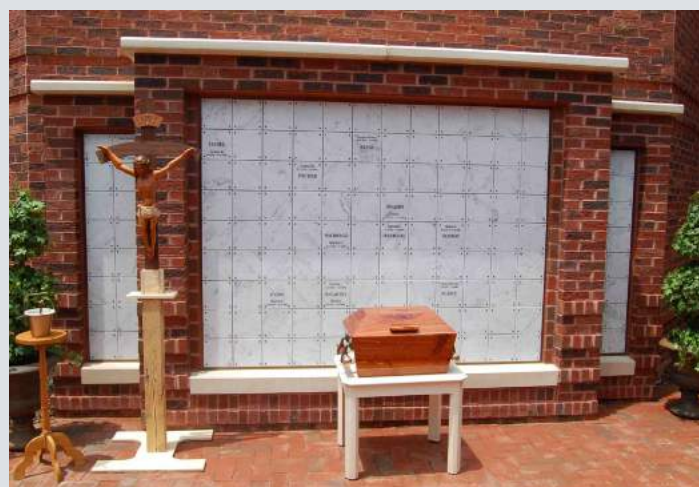


APPENDIX

WALL NICHES

Comes preassembled or in components assembled on site.

Comprised of a foundation, frame, niche boxes (made from aluminum or Nylene), and secured doors.



VAULTS (IN GROUND NICHE)

Comprised of a memorial stone with a niche cavity, or as a memorial stone atop a buried niche.



CREMATION BENCHES

Comprised of a foundation and memorial stone shaped as seating. The niche may be located within the bench cavity or buried under the foundation.



STANDARD BENCHES

Traditional “park” benches that may be placed alongside memorial stones or on foundations atop buried niche.
