Mary,

As Fernandina Beach grew in popularity, so did the visitors to our beaches. With nearly 1 million people visiting the beach each year, the city began to struggle to keep the beaches clean. By 2018 the city had over 150 trash barrels on and around our beaches. Servicing all these containers was difficult as a majority of these were located on the beach. During the summer months, the garbage barrels had to be emptied daily. The city worked with the county and passed a Leave No Trace ordinance. This ordinance provided that all items left on the beach (chairs, tents, cabanas, beach toys, etc) was regarded as trash and was removed daily. This was a monumental move in helping keep our beaches clean. The trash barrels continued to pose a problem for several reasons:

- Trash on the beach is harmful to native wildlife, birds would frequently pull trash out of the barrels
- Visual blight - no one wants to look out over a beach landscape and see barrels full of trash
- Garbage companies aren't equipped to remove trash from beach, garbage had to be handled twice
- Blue barrels have limited capacity, approx 35-55 gallon

Staff took a step back to rethink how to best handle trash. We learned that state parks and other communities begun to remove trash containers from protected areas. "Pack in and pack out" became the standard approach and the city followed suit. Over the next year staff completed the following:

- Visited Mount Dora & City of Gainesville to examine their solar trash compactors, found they are unreliable and do not hold up well in a marine environment
- Solicited proposals for the placement of trash receptacles west of the dunes
- Purchased custom built garbage cart garages from DG Morris, garages are built for a marine environment and made from recycled plastic and stainless/aluminum hardware.
- Removed over 150 55-g blue barrels from the beach
- Worked with County on an RFP for beach cleaning services, contract awarded to Beach Rakers, they clean the beach daily

It's been a journey, but we have clean beaches that are well maintained. If you have any further questions, please let me know.
