6.2 Waterfront Park Playground Area/Structure (Recommendation to the City Commission / Staying Within The Area of the Existing plan or expanding the area to fit a larger play structure in the park)

Mr. Mikelson reviewed with the Committee the area at the Waterfront Park designated as a play area. He then presented two play structure options. Option one, the lighthouse, stays within the current footprint and budget already determined by the City Commission. The second option, the ship, would expand the footprint and increase the budget.

Vice Chair Mountjoy made a motion to approve the ship structure and expand the area and budget. Member Curry second the motion. The motion failed 4-3.

Member Cocchi made a motion to find a play structure that fits in with the current 27ft footprint that can accommodate as many age ranges as possible staying within the current budget. Member Pearlstine second the motion. The motion passed 7-0.

Our Cemetery is currently running out of traditional graves. Estimated: 600 graves remaining. These graves will sell in about 5 years.

- **More cost effective than traditional burials**
- **Meets growing demand/preference**
- **Environmentally friendly**
- **Creates a lasting memorial**
- **Population growth**
- **Currently burying cremains in traditional graves**
- **Provides a new revenue stream**
- **Extends the time before the perpetual care fund is needed**

How we got here?

- FY20: \$16,000.00 was spent on a conceptual design (Marquis Latimer +Halback, Inc.)
- Stakeholders: Amelia Island–Fernandina Restoration Foundation, Friends of Bosque Bello, and City Staff
- March of 2021: Staff presented conceptual design to City Commission. It failed to move forward to construction drawing phase

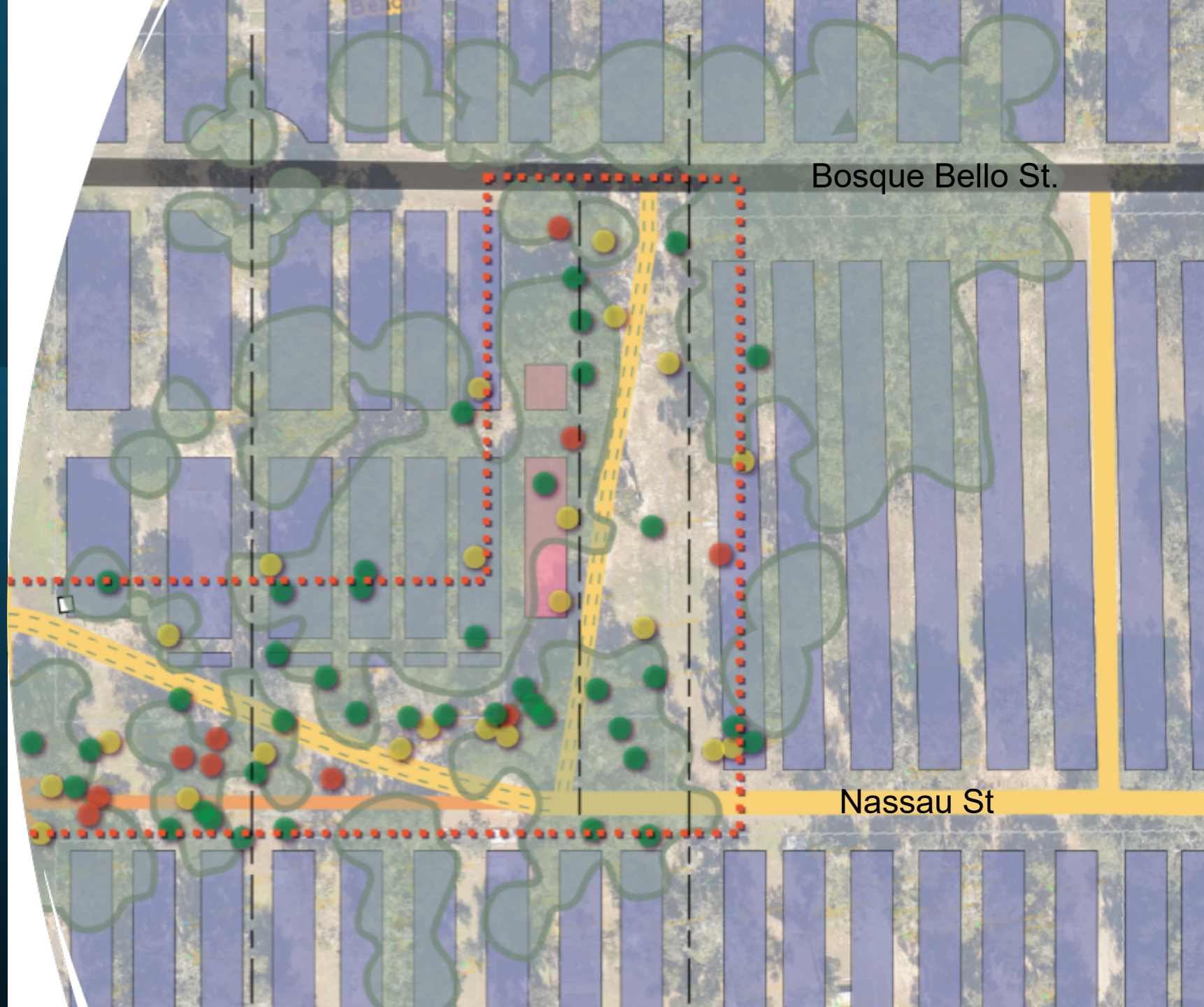

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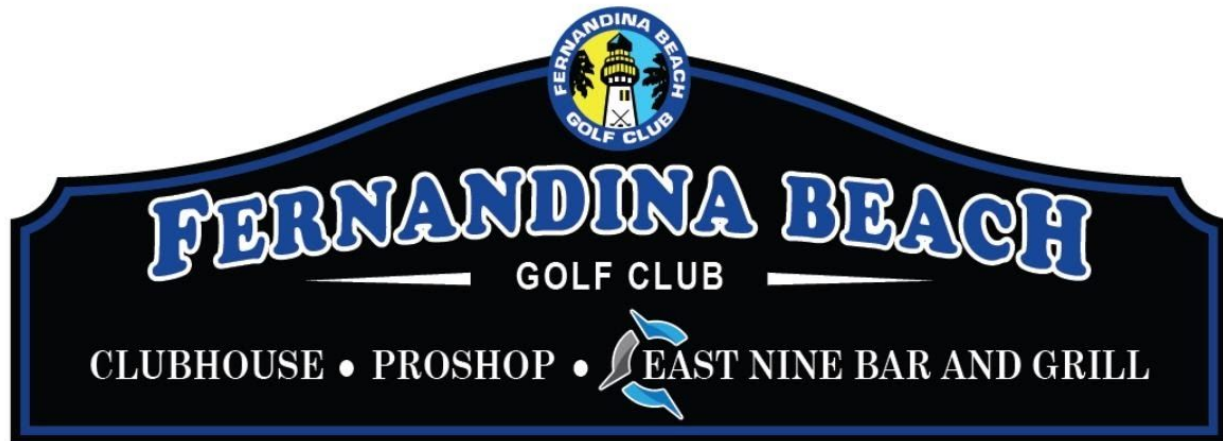
